Key to Survey Scoring: For each set of questions tabulate your score using the following numerical values. The scoring is weighted with the “neutral” NS answer being a negative score, because if you are uncertain one of these matters then you are not receiving the benefit God wants to provide for you.

CD – Negative 3 points

SD – Negative 2 points

NS – Negative 1 point

SA – Positive 1 points

CA – Positive 2 points

If your total score...

...**matches or exceeds the total number of questions**, then this is an area of strength.

...**is less than the total number of questions**, then this area could use attention or refinement.

...**is a negative number**, then this area should be given immediate and concentrated attention.

- Questions 1-5: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**your personal experience with the gospel.**” Sharing the gospel begins with experiencing Christ. You are not “selling a product” but giving testimony to something that changed your life. The hope you have is one of God’s primary tools for drawing people to Himself through you.

- Questions 6-10: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**your ability to articulate the gospel.**” Sharing the gospel does not need to be a theological treatise, but simply your story in stages the other person can follow. Being able to connect the major themes of the gospel with a few Bible passages (Romans 3:23, 5:8-10, 6:23, and 10:9-10) is all that is necessary.

- Questions 11-15: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**your everyday awareness of evangelism.**” Too often evangelism joins the list of “good things we should be doing” (along with Bible reading, prayer, exercise, eating healthy, talking with our spouse, etc...). Unless we root it into our day we will only feel guilty when we hear the word “evangelism” and this guilt association will add to the reasons we don’t do it.

- Questions 16-20: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**your social experience of evangelism.**” It has been said, “Evangelism is a conversation between two nervous people.” As long as fear does not produce silence, that is fine. It is a sign of the fear of the Lord and love for people that we would share important truths rather than retreating into our personal comfort.

- Questions 21-25: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**your burden for evangelism and missions.**” There is a creepy scene in a scary movie where a little girl says, “I see dead people.” But evangelism is sparked by a similar type of vision. Do you see people “dead in their sins (Eph 2:1)” and long for them to know true life in Christ (John 10:10)?

- Questions 26-30: (Total: _____ in 5 questions)

This set of questions examines “**your participation in missions.**” Until you know a missionary and have put your shoes on foreign soil for the sake of advancing God’s kingdom, it is easy for evangelism and missions to seem like “a good theory of the Christian life.” When you gain a first-person taste of missions God uses that to create an appetite for the world that will cause you to pray Psalm 2:8, “Ask me [God], and I will make the nations your heritage, and the ends of the earth your possession.”
